

END CELINA'S ALPR PROGRAM.

REMOVE ALL 47 READERS.

Stop collection. Reject every renewal. Close outside access. End the automatic DPS transfer. Verify deletion.

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Why removal

- Every passing vehicle can become a searchable record even when its driver is not suspected of a crime.
- Celina publishes activity counts, but not local outcomes or the search-level audit behind its total search count.
- Broad sharing and the daily DPS transfer extend exposure beyond the City.
- The policy includes safeguards but still permits queries without reasonable suspicion or probable cause.
- The City has not published a complete local account of confirmed benefits, errors, or outside searches.

What Council should do

1. Begin a public review of the program.
2. Publish the missing local outcomes, search audit, outside searches, and sharing history.
3. Explain why routine collection from ordinary drivers should continue.
4. Hear from residents before renewing or expanding the system.
5. End the program and authorize removal of all 47 city-operated readers.

START THE PUBLIC PROCESS FOR REMOVAL

Put ending the program on the table.

Ask the City to publish the missing results, hear from residents, and explain why collection should continue.

EMAIL CITY COUNCIL. KEEP REMOVAL AS THE GOAL.
